### February 14 & 15: SAMVAD 2025 - 2nd International Conference



On 14 - 15 February, 2025, IIIM hosted Samvad 2025 - 2nd International Conference on "Future - Ready Organizations and Sustainability." The conference opened with a thought-provoking keynote address by Prof. Anna Zarkada (Professor, Cyprus University of Technology - Cyprus), emphasizing "Future Management for Sustainable Prosperity," urging organizations to prioritize ethical leadership, circular economy principles, and collective responsibility for long-term success. The first plenary session by Prof. Sachithra Lokuge (Professor, University of Southern Queensland - Australia), highlighted the transformative power of data in driving innovation, while Prof. Muhammad Kashif Saeed (Professor, Nust Business School) in the second plenary session, stressed the urgent need to integrate social sustainability into management practices. 
## **HAPPENINGS @ IIIM**

### LEGAL PERSPECTIVE: DIGITAL ARREST

Gali Gali mai Firta hai.....Tu Kyn Ban kay...Banjara...!!!!!

The digital age has brought unprecedented connectivity, but it has also introduced a new frontier for law enforcement: Digital Arrest...!

Picture this: You are frantically finishing your daily tasks when unexpectedly a call from a unfamiliar person comes in. Identifying himself as a senior police officer, the caller blames you for participating in a financial laundering operation. Though you first refuse the charges, the caller links you with some instances which make you believe that you might have been involved in this supposed case. Later, the caller asks you to present your room and then lock yourself away from other people until the investigation is done. By the end of the calls, you locate yourself sending big sums of money to the bank account information given by the caller to erase your name from the files.

Is this a screenplay for a crime thriller? Tragically, this is the reality experienced by many people who fell prey to the "digital arrest" scam, whereby criminals pretending to be higherups stole big sums of money. Indeed, Indians lost Rs 1,777 crore to cyber fraud in just the first four months of 2024, according to cyber cell information. Rs 120 crore of this total was lost to digital arrest scam. Even more shockingly, inquiries found that 46% of these scams were perpetrated from sites including Myanmar, Laos, and Cambodia.

Now, you are mistaken if you think that only those unfamiliar with technology will fall for these scams. Particularly the digital arrest con, these digital frauds are aiming at people in all fields—from working professionals to senior citizens. In fact, a few weeks ago on Aaj Tak, senior assistant editor Richa Mishra shared her experience of becoming a target of a cyber-arrest scam. She disclosed that it all began with a phone from a courier service incorrectly stating her Aadhaar number was connected to a package of drugs.

So once you think someone is doing all this to you.... Stay Calm...!!! Take recording...! Take Screen Shots...!! And Call the Police.!!!
